The Alberta node of Canadian Cooperative Wildlife Health Centre (CCWHC) is seeking an interested and highly motivated candidate for the Internship in wildlife health, starting in July 2014. This position is targeted towards recently graduated veterinarians who want to enhance their knowledge and skills in the areas of wildlife health, wildlife conservation and wildlife management. The internship is for a year (July 2014-June 2015) and is based at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, University of Calgary.

The Intern will be provided with the opportunity to gain skills in wildlife pathology and parasitology as well as be actively involved in wildlife health management projects in collaboration with our partners/stakeholders. He/she will have a supervisory team that includes a wildlife pathologist, the CWHC parasitologist, and the Alberta CCWHC Director. The intern will split his/her time approximately equally (30%) between wildlife pathology service, wildlife parasitology service, and working on specific case studies and projects. The remaining time will be spent participating in wildlife disease and epidemiology journal clubs, intern rounds, seminar series, and delivery of short courses. Interns will be expected to present cases regularly at intern rounds and produce one publishable paper. The Intern is also expected to contribute to CWHC blog site: healthywildlife.ca

Qualifications: Candidates should be recently graduated from any vet schools in Canada. Must be industrious, passionate about science, highly organized, and have demonstrated competence as team players.

Stipend: \$30,000/year with potential for top-up funding if the candidate is successful in securing external funding.
